
# GTC Management Company Wealth Accumulator Fund of Funds


### Investment mandate and objective

The equity based portfolio incorporates deep value and core equity investment managers within a multi-manager solution that aims to outperform the FTSE/JSE Shareholders Weighted Index (SWIX) over a three year period. The value bias implies the use of qualitative and quantitative techniques to identify and invest into good quality companies trading at discounted prices. This combination of investment managers integrates risk management strategies to provide consistent returns with reduced volatility during all market conditions.

Performance fees are absolute return based, which implies that performance fees are only accrued on positive performances above an adjusted cash benchmark.

Base fees were 2.39% (Class A) and 1.74% (Class B) Equity performance fees

Absolute based performance fee -20 % of outperformance of Alexander Forbes MM +3% (Capped at 2%).

Performance fees of 3.36% (Class A) and 3.20% (Class B) were levied on the fund due to outperformance of the benchmark.

#### Total expense ratio (TER)

A Total Expense Ratio (TER) is a measure of a portfolio's assets that are relinquished as operating expenses. The total operating expenses are expressed as a percentage of the average value of the portfolio. Included in the TER is the proportion of costs that are incurred by the performance component, fee at target, trading costs (including brokerage, VAT, STT, STRATE and insider trading levy) and other expenses. These are disclosed separately as percentages of the net asset value. A higher TER ratio does not necessarily imply a poor return, nor does a low TER imply a good return. The current TER cannot be regarded as an indication of future TERs. The total TER\* was therefore 5.76% (Class A) and 4.94% (Class B).





Global equity markets continued their upward trend over the quarter with the MSCI World posting 1.7 %(USD) mainly on the back of strong US(2.1% USD) and Japanese(5.2% USD) gains with Europe flat(-0.1% USD). EM markets also benefitted from the risk on environment, posting 2.0% (USD) while global fixed income markets returned 0.4%(USD) in June. Investors chose to focus on positive job data from the US despite Q1 GDP contraction due to inclement weather.


Locally, the JSE benefitted from the rising tide posting 7.2%(ZAR). Industrials led the charge posting 9.1% with financials (7.8%) and resources (2.9%) also rising. The protracted AMCU strike as well as a decline in commodity prices weighed heavy on the resource sector.

With the termination of the RE:CM mandate, we have reduced the deep value bias and introduced a protected equity strategy with Prescient. Currently the Prescient strategy has an effective 75% equity exposure.
